




How many native bee species are in North America?

A 700 B. 4,000 C. 16,000 D. 32,000 There are plenty of bee species that are not honey producers or have a vibrant social life. It is important to plant a wide variety of flowering plants to attract a diverse pollinator population.



Another way to support native bees is to protect your garden over winter and to leave it relatively untouched. Bees use the bare dirt, dead stems, and even logs to nest in.
